






UNIT FIVE: Instruments of the Orchestra

Here is a picture of an orchestra. The instruments are generally positioned in the same places and are organised into sections of instruments.



There are four main sections in the orchestra. Instruments that belong to the orchestral **STRING SECTION** have bows and metal strings. They are the violin, viola, violoncello (cello for short) and double bass.

Instruments that belong to the orchestral **WOODWIND SECTION** were originally made from wood and are blown to produce sound. They are the flute, oboe, clarinet and bassoon.


Instruments that belong to the orchestral **BRASS SECTION** have always been made from metal. They can be silver or gold in colour. The sound is produced when players buzz with their lips into a mouthpiece. (It's like blowing a raspberry.) The brass instruments are the trumpet, French horn, trombone and tuba.

Instruments that belong to the **PERCUSSION SECTION** are struck or shaken to produce a sound. There are many instruments in this section. Here is a list of just some of them: timpani, any drum, xylophone, glockenspiel, vibraphone, metallophone, tambourine, triangle, cymbals, castanets, maracas, guiro, vibraslap ... and many more!

- 1. On the picture of the orchestra to the left, gently shade the string section in yellow.
- Gently shade the woodwind section in light blue.
- 3. Gently shade the brass section in light green.
- 4. Gently shade the percussion section in orange.
- 5. Cut out the yellow memory cards from inside the front cover. Each time you practise matching the instruments to their section name, say the name of each of the instruments to yourself. This will help you to learn them more quickly. Try this now.

Directions for Labels

The percussion and timpani sit at the very back row of the orchestra. The harp occupies the smallest space and the 1st violins sit at the front, next to the harp. The 2nd violins sit next to the 1st. The violas are directly in front of you. Double basses are behind the cellos and finish the string section (which is the largest).

The flutes are behind the violas to the left. The oboes sit next to the flutes and are directly in front of the bassoons. The clarinets sit next to the bassoons and in front of the horns. The trombones and tuba sit a row behind the bassoons to the right and the trumpets sit next to them.






